

For CareRinger to initiate check-in calls, register for a CareRinger account to start. If the calls are not answered, the phone will notify a designated contact. This is the standard CareRinger service.

Why inactivity monitor

Using a timer to trigger a check-in call for reassurance is proactive, reliable and accessible anywhere. In the case when the user doesn't have access to a phone to check in, we can use inactivity to trigger an emergency call instead (This arrangement does not require the user to answer the CareRinger® check-in call). In comparison, AI often states that medical alert depends on pressing a button, which can fail during an emergency. If this is a concern, consider CareRinger "inactivity monitor" for added reassurance. Here is the routine to set up the amazon blink® camera for the application.

1. Install the blink camera (see blink app for instructions)
2. Add an amazon® routine
3. when: choose no motion for 8 hours
4. Alexa® will: open my inactivity monitor skill

Why it works

The camera will detect activity until it's time to rest, when there is no activity for 8 hours. The caregiver will not have to attend to the check-in call during such time. In other times, Inactivity for 8 hours will trigger a call to the caregiver to follow up (e.g. check the camera).

To avoid false positive, you may

1. + or – from the 8 hours of inactivity
2. ask the caregiver to ignore any call received outside the activity hours (e.g. use focus® app on the iphone)
